



## LOCAL RULES

- **Out of Bounds** (Rule 27) is defined by white stakes and lines (holes No 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 17, 18) or a fence bordering the course (10<sup>th</sup> hole).
  - **Inner Out of Bounds** defined right to the 9th hole is applicable **only when playing the 9th hole**. When playing the 18<sup>th</sup> hole the black/white stakes are movable obstructions.
  - **Inner Out of Bounds** between 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> holes, applicable **only when playing the 13<sup>th</sup> hole**, is defined partly by white stakes and lines and partly by red/white stakes and red lines, which also define the lateral water hazard when playing the 14<sup>th</sup> hole. When playing the 14<sup>th</sup> hole the red/white stakes are movable obstructions.
- **Lateral water hazards** (Rule 26-1) are defined by red stakes and lines.
  - **The island part** of the lake between the holes No. 13 and 14 with the piled up sand and gravel is a **part of the lateral water hazard** from which **the play is prohibited**. The player must take a relief under the Rule 26-1 and shall neither enter the area nor retrieve the ball.
- **Sandy waste areas** (recognizable by reddish sand) are **not hazards**.
- Stones in bunkers are **movable obstructions**.
- **Ground Under Repair** areas (Rule 25-1) are defined by blue stakes or white lines.
- **Bunkers** marked by a **blue stake in the middle** are considered to be **Ground Under Repair through the green** with the margin of the GUR being defined by the margin of the bunker.
- When taking relief from the **Ground Under Repair** (Rule 25-1) **at back of the 13th green** the player may, as an **additional option**, drop a ball, without penalty, in a **dropping zone**. The dropping zone is defined as an area marked by white paint and a sign DZ.
- **Only** when there is **no spot providing a full relief** from interference by **casual water in a bunker** (Rule 25-1) the player may, as an **additional option**, drop a ball, without penalty, in a **dropping zone**, providing such a dropping zone in the bunker is defined. Such eventual dropping zone is defined as an area within one club length from a stake with a sign DZ.
- **Young trees with wooden shielding** are **immovable obstructions** and the player **must**, in case of interference, take a relief according to the Rule 24-2.
- All **artificial** (concrete or gravel) **roads** including the adjoining mended, seeded, turfed or marked areas are **immovable obstructions**.
- **The power poles** through the green are **immovable obstructions**. Player is not entitled to a free relief for interference on the line of play only.
- When a ball strikes a **power line through the green** the stroke must be cancelled and replayed, without penalty.

### Penalty for Breach of a Local Rule:

**Match play – Loss of hole; Stroke play – Two strokes**

- All white painted distances are in meters to the front of the green, including the par 3 holes tee boxes.
- Keep up with the **time limit** (see the other side of the Pin Positions) and with the group in front.
- Replace divots, repair pitch-marks and rake bunkers.
